

## **YOUTH & FAMILY RIGHTS**

- 1. The right to be given a copy of these rights and to be informed of them in a way that is easily understood.
- 2. The right to be treated with respect and dignity.
- 3. The right to treatment/services in the least restrictive setting.
- 4. The right to impartial access to treatment/services regardless of race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, ethnicity, age, disability or other legally protected class.
- 5. The right to have treatment/service information and records kept confidential except when the law or safety concerns require disclosure.

- 6. The right to have reasonable opportunities to meet with your Child-Family Team.
- 7. The right to decline treatment/services.
- 8. The right to participate in the development of the Individualized Service Plan (ISP) and to receive a copy of the plan.
- 9. The right to receive treatment/services in a safe and nurturing environment.
- 10. The right to access and/or request to amend your Electronic Health Record (See HIPPA Notice of Privacy Practices for more information).
- 11. The right to voice grievances and complaints without retaliation.
- 12. The right to be free from abuse & neglect.
