



YOUTH & FAMILY RIGHTS

1. The right to be given a copy of these rights and to be informed of them in a way that is easily understood.
2. The right to be treated with respect and dignity.
3. The right to treatment/services in the least restrictive setting.
4. The right to impartial access to treatment/services regardless of race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, ethnicity, age, disability or other legally protected class.
5. The right to have treatment/service information and records kept confidential except when the law or safety concerns require disclosure.
6. The right to have reasonable opportunities to meet with your Child-Family Team.
7. The right to decline treatment/services.
8. The right to participate in the development of the Individualized Service Plan (ISP) and to receive a copy of the plan.
9. The right to receive treatment/services in a safe and nurturing environment.
10. The right to access and/or request to amend your Electronic Health Record (See HIPPA Notice of Privacy Practices for more information).
11. The right to voice grievances and complaints without retaliation.
12. The right to be free from abuse & neglect.
