

As part of ongoing safety, Partners For Kids and Families Inc., is providing First Aid/CPR/AED certification training for employees.





The month of Ramadan commemorates the revelation of the Qur'an, the sacred book of Muslims. Muslims are required to fast from dawn to sunset for this 9th month on the Muslim calendar. In addition, Muslims are encouraged to be more charitable and exhibit the best character. The month ends with a congregational prayer, providing food for the needy and a celebration called Eid al-Fitra



The first national observance of Memorial Day occurred on May 30, 1868. Then known as Decoration Day, the holiday was proclaimed by Commander in Chief John A. Logan of the Grand Army of the Republic to honor the Union soldiers who had died in the Civil War.



Juneteenth (short for "June Nineteenth") marks the day when federal troops arrived in Galveston, Texas in 1865 to take control of the state and ensure that all enslaved people be freed. The troops' arrival came a full two and a half years after the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation.



Pride Month is an annual celebration of the many contributions made by the LGBTQ+ community to history, society and cultures worldwide. In most places, Pride is celebrated throughout the month of June each year in commemoration of its roots in the Stonewall Riots of June 1969.
